I. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with details of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors to be dealt with at the forthcoming AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The Directors propose to seek the approval of the Shareholders at the AGM for the following:

1. Issue Mandate to issue Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the Shares in issue (excluding any Treasury Shares) as at the date of passing the relevant resolution;
2. Repurchase Mandate to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the Shares in issue (excluding any Treasury Shares) as at the date of passing the relevant resolution; and
3. the Issue Mandate shall be extended to the Shares that are allowed to be repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

II. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

Ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM: (i) to grant an Issue Mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital (excluding any Treasury Shares) of the Company as at the date of passing such resolution; and (ii) to approve the addition to the Issue Mandate of any Shares repurchased by the Company under the authority of the Repurchase Mandate as at the date of passing such resolution. The Directors have no present intention to issue any new Shares. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 587,107,850. On the basis of such figure (assuming no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the date of passing such resolution), the Directors would be authorised to issue Shares up to a maximum of 58,710,785.

III. GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed that the Directors be granted a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares subject to the criteria set out in this letter. The Shareholders should note that the authority relates only to repurchase made on the Stock Exchange and otherwise in accordance with the Listing Rules. All repurchases of Shares must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution, which may be by way of general mandate, or by specific approval in relation to specific transactions.

In addition, the general mandate will continue in force during the Relevant Period (as referred to in paragraph (c) of resolution no. 6 set out in the notice of the AGM), which means the period from the passing of the resolution until whichever is the earlier of:

- (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
- (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws or any applicable laws to be held; or
- (iii) the revocation or variation of the authority given under the resolution by ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

An explanatory statement as required under the Listing Rules to provide the requisite information on the Repurchase Mandate is set out in Appendix I hereto.

IV. RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

In relation to the resolution no. 3 set out in the notice of the AGM, pursuant to Bye-law 99 of the Bye-laws, Mr. WONG Wai Sheung, Ms. WONG Hau Yeung, Mr. LI Hon Hung, BBS, MH, JP and Ms. WONG Yu Pok, Marina, JP, shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. All the retiring Directors, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the AGM, except Ms. WONG Yu Pok, Marina, JP who does not offer herself for re-election owing to personal engagement. Pursuant to Bye-law 102(B) of the Bye-laws, Mr. Anson KWOK, who was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director on 21 August 2025, will retire at the AGM and, being eligible, has offered himself for re-election. Ms. WONG Yu Pok, Marina, JP, who is retiring, confirmed that she has no disagreement with the Board, her retirement is not due to reasons relating to the affairs of the Company, and there are no matters relating to her retirement that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders. The Board would like to express its sincere gratitude to Ms. WONG Yu Pok, Marina, JP for her valuable efforts and contributions to the Board during the tenure of her office.

Mr. Anson KWOK has confirmed his independence in accordance with the independence guidelines set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Having considered Mr. KWOK's independence, skills, knowledge and experience, the Board believes that he will continue to provide independent, balanced and objective views on the Company's business, and contribute valuable business experience, knowledge and professional judgment to the Board, thereby ensuring its efficiency, effective operation and diversity.

The Nomination Committee has reviewed the structure, size and composition of the Board. With reference to the nomination principles and criteria set out in the Company's Nomination Policy and the Board Diversity Policy and taking into account each of the abovementioned Directors' contributions to the Board and their commitment to their roles, the Nomination Committee has recommended to the Board the re-appointment of all Directors who will retire and offer for re-election at the AGM.

Biographical details of the retiring Directors proposed for re-election are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

V. RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

The financial statements of the Group for the financial year ended 31 March 2026 were audited by PricewaterhouseCoopers whose term of office will expire upon the conclusion of the AGM.

Upon the recommendation of the Audit Committee of the Company, the Board proposes to re-appoint PricewaterhouseCoopers as the auditor of the Company to hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company. At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed for the re-appointment of auditor of the Company and to authorise the Board to fix the remuneration of the auditor for the financial year ending 31 March 2027.

The estimated audit fee for the annual audit of the consolidated financial statements of the Group for the financial year ending 31 March 2027 is expected to be in the range of approximately HK\$7,050,000 to HK\$7,400,000 which is determined after due consideration and arm's length negotiation between the Company and PricewaterhouseCoopers. The estimation takes into account various factors such as the size and structure of the Group, the nature and complexity of the Group's businesses, the expected scope and timetable of the audit, and the level and mix of professional staff to be deployed by the auditor.

Furthermore, the estimated audit fee is a fair and reasonable assessment based on the facts and circumstances currently known, and may be subject to adjustment if there is any material change in the relevant circumstances prior to the final determination of the audit fee.

PricewaterhouseCoopers have indicated their willingness to be re-appointed as auditor of the Company for the said period.

VI. NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Notice of the AGM is set out on pages 17 to 21 of this circular. A form of proxy for appointing proxy is despatched with this circular and published on the websites of HKEX (www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (lukfook.com) respectively. Whether or not you intend to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete the form of proxy in accordance with the instructions stated thereon and return it to the Company's share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, at 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong, as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof if you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of Shareholders at general meetings must be taken by poll. The chairman of the AGM will demand a poll for every resolution put to the vote at the AGM pursuant to the Bye-laws. An announcement on the poll voting results will be published on the websites of HKEX (www.hkexnews.hk) and the Company (lukfook.com) respectively after the AGM in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

VII. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

VIII. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the proposed granting of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate, the extension of the Issue Mandate and the re-election of the retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company as well as its Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend you to vote in favour of all relevant resolutions set out in the notice of the AGM.

This Appendix serves as an Explanatory Statement as required by the Listing Rules, to provide certain information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there was a total of 587,107,850 Shares in issue (excluding any Treasury Shares).

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase up to a maximum of 58,710,785 Shares, being 10% of the issued share capital of the Company (excluding any Treasury Shares) as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution for granting the Repurchase Mandate.

If the Company purchases any Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the Company will either cancel the repurchased Shares and/or hold such Shares in treasury, subject to market conditions and the Company's capital management needs at the relevant time any repurchases of Shares are made. If the Company holds any Shares in treasury, any sale or transfer of Shares held in treasury will be subject to the terms of the Issue Mandate and made in accordance with the Listing Rules and applicable laws and regulations of Bermuda.

For any Treasury Shares deposited with CCASS pending resale on the Stock Exchange, the Company will (i) not (or will procure its broker not to) give any instructions to Hong Kong Securities Clearing Company Limited to vote at general meetings for the Treasury Shares deposited with CCASS; and (ii) in the case of dividends or distributions, withdraw the Treasury Shares from CCASS, and either re-register them in its own name as Treasury Shares or cancel them, in each case before the record date for the dividends or distributions, or take any other measures to ensure that it will not exercise any Shareholders' rights or receive any entitlements which would otherwise be suspended under the applicable laws if those Shares were registered in its own name as Treasury Shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the Stock Exchange, or on any other stock exchange on which the Shares may be listed. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases of Shares would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Memorandum of Association of the Company, the Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda. Repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be financed entirely from the Company's paid up share capital plus funds available for dividends or distribution to Shareholders and the share premium account.

The exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full might have a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the Company's annual report for the year ended 31 March 2026. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company unless the Directors consider that such purchases are in the best interests of the Company.

4. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is granted by Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will only exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the applicable laws of Bermuda and the Bye-laws.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell, or have undertaken not to sell, any Shares to the Company in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchases of Shares.

5. TAKEOVERS CODE CONSEQUENCES

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code), depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's or group of Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. WONG Wai Sheung, the Chairman, Chief Executive Officer, Executive Director, and a substantial Shareholder of the Company, together with parties presumed to be acting in concert with him under the Takeovers Code (“**WWS Concert Group**”) were interested in 265,856,054 Shares in aggregate, representing approximately 45.28% of the issued share capital of the Company.

In the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, the interest of the WWS Concert Group in the issued share capital of the Company would be increased from approximately 45.28% to approximately 50.31% and the WWS Concert Group would be obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent that would give rise to an obligation on the part of the WWS Concert Group to make a mandatory general offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. Save as aforesaid, the Board is not aware of any consequences which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of an exercise of the Repurchase Mandate.

6. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not repurchased any of its Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the 6 months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

The biographical details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM are set out as follows:

Mr. WONG Wai Sheung

Mr. WONG Wai Sheung, aged 75, is the founder, Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and Executive Director of the Group. He is also a member of the Nomination Committee. Mr. WONG has over 59 years of experience in the jewellery industry and is responsible for the overall strategic planning and management of the Group. He is the Perpetual Honorary President of The Kowloon Gold Silver and Jewel Merchant's Staff Association, the Honorary Permanent Chairman of Hong Kong Jade Association, the Chairman of Supervisory Committee of The Kowloon Pearls, Precious Stones, Jade, Gold and Silver Ornament Merchants Association, the Consultant of the Gems & Jewelry Trade Association of China, the Founding Member and Vice President of Shenzhen Gold & Silver Jewelry Creative Industry Association, a Respectable Advisor of Hong Kong Gold & Silver Ornament Workers & Merchants General Union, the Honorary President of the Jewellers' & Goldsmiths' Association of Hong Kong Limited and a Senior Adviser of International Collaboration and Development Centre for the Gold and Jewellery Industry, Gold Association of Guangdong Province. Mr. WONG is the father of Mr. WONG Ho Lung, Danny, Deputy Chairman and Executive Director of the Group and Ms. WONG Lan Sze, Nancy, Executive Director and Deputy Chief Executive Officer of the Group. He is also the elder brother of Mr. WONG Wai Tong, Senior Business Director of the Group.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. WONG was interested in 262,826,074 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. For the year ended 31 March 2026, his total emoluments amounted to HK\$42,761,352, including the entitled annual director's fees of HK\$55,000.

Ms. WONG Hau Yeung

Ms. WONG Hau Yeung, aged 53, is the Executive Director and Chief Operating Officer of the Group. Since 2024, she has been an Executive Director of 3DG International. Ms. WONG initially joined the Group in 1994 and served various departments for about 8 years until 2002. She rejoined the Group in 2004. Currently, she is responsible for the Group's operations and development of the retail, wholesale and licensing businesses. In addition, she is also responsible for the administration and human resources functions of the Group. She holds a Master's Degree in Business Administration from University of Southern Queensland. Ms. WONG is a Member of Guangzhou Panyu District Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, a Member of District Fight Crime Committee (Kwai Tsing District), a Member of The Association of the Hong Kong Members of Guangdong's Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference Committees Limited, an Honorary Life President and the 20th Term Vice-Chairman of Hong Kong Pun Yue Industrial and Commercial Fellowship Association, the 6th Term Standing Director of Guangzhou Panyu Overseas Friendship Association, a Director of Guangzhou Panyu Overseas Exchange Association, a Vice-President of Panyu Hong Kong Charity Fund Limited, a Chairperson of The Jewellery Industry Training Advisory Committee of Hong Kong Qualifications Framework, a Member of Watch & Jewellery Industry Consultative Networks of Employees Retraining Board, a Governing Council Member of Quality Tourism Services Association, an Industry Advisor of Fei Cui Standard Project of The Gemmological Association of Hong Kong Limited, a Director of Hong Kong Genuine Goods Alliance and a Member of Greater Bay Area Hong Kong Women Entrepreneurs Association. In 2021, Ms. WONG was awarded the "Greater Bay Area Outstanding Women Entrepreneur Awards" by the Hong Kong Small and Medium Enterprises Association and Metro Finance. She has over 32 years of experience in the jewellery industry.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. WONG did not have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. For the year ended 31 March 2026, her total emoluments amounted to HK\$12,830,860, including the entitled annual director's fees of HK\$110,000 for acting as an Executive Director of both the Company and a subsidiary of the Company.

Mr. LI Hon Hung, *BBS, MH, JP*

Mr. LI Hon Hung, *BBS, MH, JP*, aged 69, was appointed as a Non-executive Director of the Company in 2011. Mr. LI holds a Diploma of Architectural Design from Humber College of Toronto, Canada in 1981 and a Bachelor's of Architecture from New York Institute of Technology in 1984. Mr. LI was awarded the Certificate of Registration Authorized Person (List of Architects) in 1989 and the Certificate of Registered Inspector in 2012, by the Hong Kong Government respectively. In professional qualification aspect, Mr. LI is a Fellow of Hong Kong Institute of Architects and a Member of Architect Registration Board. He also got the PRC Class 1 Registered Architect Qualification. Mr. LI has extensive architecture experience and is a Director of Li & Siu Associates Ltd. and A. Li & Associates Architects Ltd. In addition, he is a Director of Keen Mind Kindergarten. Mr. LI was appointed as a District Council Member of Sham Shui Po District from 2000 to 2007 and awarded the Chief Executive's Commendation for Community Service and Medal of Honor. He was also appointed by the Hong Kong Government a Justice of the Peace in 2008 and was awarded a Bronze Bauhinia Star (BBS) in 2017. Mr. LI has been appointed to various positions over the years including Chairman of Sham Shui Po District Office (East Liaison Team), Chairman of Sham Shui Po District Fire Safety Committee, Chairman of Sham Shui Po Council for the Promotion of Cultural and Recreation Service Limited, Chairman of Sham Shui Po District Fight Crime Committee, Honorary President of Sham Shui Po District Junior Police Call, Honorary President of Kowloon City District Junior Police Call, Honorary President of Yau Tsim District Junior Police Call, Chairman of Yau Yat Chuen Residents Association Ltd., President of Police Dragon Boat Club and Chartered President of Lions Club of Sham Shui Po Hong Kong. Mr. LI is a member of The Sixth Election Committee of the Hong Kong SAR. He is also an Independent Non-executive Director of Sheung Yue Group Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 1633) which is listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. LI was interested in 10,564,292 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. For the year ended 31 March 2026, his total emoluments amounted to HK\$170,000, including the entitled annual director's fees of HK\$110,000.

Mr. Anson KWOK

Mr. Anson KWOK, aged 65, is a senior banker in Hong Kong with 37 years of extensive experience in international banking management and possesses profound expertise in the areas of risk management, internal control, and compliance. Mr. KWOK is currently an Adjunct Associate Professor at the Business School of The University of Hong Kong and the Business School of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, and serves as a Senior Advisor to FundingReach Holdings Ltd. Mr. KWOK holds a Bachelor of Science degree from The University of New South Wales, Sydney, Australia and a Master of Business Administration degree from The University of Sydney, Australia. He is Certified Credit Risk Professionals in both Commercial Loan (CCRP(CL)) and Credit Portfolio Management (CCRP(CPM)) under the Hong Kong Institute of Bankers, and a Fellow Member of The Hong Kong Institute of Directors. He was also licensed by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong as an Executive Officer responsible for securities investment at Citi Commercial Bank Hong Kong. Mr. KWOK dedicated 32 years of service to Citibank, N.A., Hong Kong Branch (“Citibank Hong Kong”) and retired in 2024. During his tenure, he held the roles of Alternate Chief Executive of Citibank Hong Kong and Head of Citi Commercial Bank. He spearheaded Citi Commercial Bank’s dual-track strategy encompassing both the new and traditional economies, successfully expanding the bank’s presence in the new economy sector while significantly growing the scale of its commercial banking franchise. Prior to joining Citibank Hong Kong, he was a Credit Executive at Chase Manhattan Bank, Sydney, Australia Branch for five years.

Mr. KWOK is actively involved in public services and community work. He currently serves as a Member of the Volunteer Services Committee of the Hong Kong Anti-Cancer Society. He previously represented Citibank Hong Kong as a Member of the Consultative Council of the Hong Kong Association of Banks and served as a Member of each of the Budget and Allocation Sub-Committee of the Community Chest of Hong Kong, the Intellectual Property Supervisory Committee under the Commerce and Economic Development Bureau of the Hong Kong SAR, China and the Credit Risk Management Advisory Committee of the Hong Kong Institute of Bankers.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. KWOK did not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. For the year ended 31 March 2026, Mr. KWOK was entitled to a director’s fee of HK\$153,082.
